RE books to come home so we can support children with their learning.	This used to happen, however we found a number of RE books were then not returned or were but very late back making the recording side of RE challenging. We therefore introduce the 'Friday Messenger' which is a weekly newsletter to all parents which informs them of the RE teaching from that week so families can discuss this at home. There is also a family task set which looks to engage them around the value theme. The Messenger also shares current events or notices from the parish.
