
Message from Mr Claxton

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EYFS

The children have adapted well to coming in for full days. This week we have been learning about God's creation and drew some wonderful self-portraits. We are getting to know our new friends and are practising working together as a team.

Year 1

In Year 1, we have had a visit from 'Beegu'. The children have been exploring the story and learning about adjectives in preparation to write a character description. In maths, the children have continued with their work on place value and have been counting backwards from 10 and finding one more and one less.



Year 2

Year 2 have enjoyed learning about Katharine of Aragon and found it fascinating that she is buried in Peterborough cathedral. In their Science lesson, they were testing different exercises and deciding which was the best for their body. Within their computing work, the children were inventing machines and explaining what the input and output of them was.

Year 3

Year 3 had a great Science lesson last week. They were learning the vocabulary of rocks so we could describe them correctly but instead of using rocks they used SWEETS! it was good fun and they even got a little treat and were allowed to eat a few afterwards.



Year 4

This week, Year 4 have enjoyed preparing for their retelling of The Egyptian Cinderella! They recapped their knowledge of speech and wrote the middle of their story with a great use of expanded noun phrases and speech. In Science, they have learnt all about the different parts of the ear and how vibrations from sounds travel through the ear to our brain. Year 4 have also continued their exploration into the era of Ancient Egypt, learning all about the hierarchy of Egyptian life, from the Pharoahs to the farmers! They studied a piece of Egyptian art and saw if they could work out each person's job from the picture using their knowledge of the hierarchy.

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
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Year 5

Year Five enjoyed learning about the planets and our solar system in Science this week. They worked in pairs to research their chosen planet and then worked as a whole class to show how the planets line up and their distances from the sun. Year Five have also learnt about the kingdoms of Anglo-Saxon Britain. They then chose which tribe they would have liked to have been part of (Angles, Saxons or Jutes) and used this to see which part of England they would have settled in and designed their own shield using the original Anglo-Saxon kingdom flag's colours and design.

Year 6



In ICT this week, Year Six started their new topic: Big Data. We looked at how large amounts of information can be sent using bar codes and QR codes and learnt that the idea for bar codes was based on Morse code that was extended to thin and thick bars. We found out that infrared waves can be used in different ways and the children were challenged with devising a new type of use for infrared technology in school. This example uses infrared to detect mistakes when writing and automatically rub them out!
