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EYFS

This week we have been looking at the book Monkey Puzzle by Julia Donaldson. We have listened to the story, sequenced pictures and retelling the story using puppets and small world animals. Our sounds this week have been 'n' and 'i' and the children have been becoming more confident in recalling the sounds we have learnt in previous weeks. Well done Reception!

Year 1

In Year 1, we have been looking at different sets of instructions. We have then used these to help write our own instructions for cleaning our teeth. In maths, we have started our addition and subtraction topic by focusing on simple addition number sentences. In PE, the children really enjoyed playing different games using the parachute.

Year 2

In year two this week, we have been writing our own fairy tales about dragons. The children created fact files about how we celebrated the Queen's jubilee. Within Science the children used their knowledge of properties of materials to design a helmet for an egg so it did not break when it was dropped from a height. The class also started our new art unit and developed mark making techniques.

Year 3

Year 3 have been making their own paint this week. We foraged for soil, leaves and other natural ingredients then we mixed it with water to see what colours we could make. After we used a flour and water paste to add nutmeg, turmeric, coriander and paprika to make different colours. We are going to use this to make cave paintings like the Stone Age people.

Year 4

In Year 4 this week, the children have started to explore the addition and subtraction topic in Maths. They have worked with adding four-digit numbers with and without exchanging. In RE this week, Year 4 explored the story of Moses. They answered three key questions: How did God show that he loved Moses? How does God show that he loves you? How does God's love for you help you to make the right choices in your life? After we investigated these questions, the children performed a role-play of the story of Moses in small groups, using key vocabulary and portraying the emotions that would be happening at the time. In our English lessons, the children have been investigating the features of a non-chronological report and they have started to research and write about Egyptian Pharaohs.

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Year 6

Our experiment to test whether *how* and *where* you store food has any effect on its rate of decay has produced some colourful results!
