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EYFS

We have started looking at 'Messages' this half term. We read about the message that Mary was given by the Angel Gabriel, that she would have a baby called Jesus. The children thought about how Mary would feel and acted this out in pairs.

Our role-play area has transformed into a Post Office! The children have really enjoyed cutting and sticking stamps and writing and posting their own messages.

Year 1

In Year one, we have been reading the story Funnybones. The children have really enjoyed writing sentences about the characters. In maths, the children have been working on addition and have been using the numicon to help them.

Year 2

Year two wrote amazing descriptions of a dragon this week, these included adjectives and conjunctions. Within theme the children were learning about the coronation and what happens during the ceremony. The children started a new Science topic 'Meet the material monsters' and they described the properties of given materials using key scientific language.

Year 3

Year three have started looking at dairies in English and thinking about the day in the life of Ug who lived in the Stone Age. In maths we are working hard adding using our number bonds. In theme we have moved on to looking at the Bronze Age. We learnt how they used sheep wool to weave into fabric.

Year 4

It has been an amazing week for Year 4! The children thoroughly enjoyed the trip to Grafham Water Centre. They took part in so many incredible activities, such as archery, climbing and bushcraft!

Year 5

This week Year Five have worked on their fantastic Anglo-Saxon fact-files. We can't wait for you to see them! In computing we have been evaluating different search engines and using them to research different aspects of Anglo-Saxon life for our fact-files. In Design and technology, we have been practising making mechanisms such as sliders and pivots for our Beowulf pop-up book. In maths we have continued working on addition and subtraction and applying our written methods to multi-step problems. We have had a very productive first week back to the half-term!
