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EYFS

We have been busy practising Whoops – a – Daisy Angel. Thank you for all your help at home – lots of the children know their lines now! Please keep practising...just over a week to go! This week in RE we have continued to learn about Jesus' birth and created our own stable scenes using lolly sticks. In Maths we have been learning about the numbers four and five. We have made different arrangements of objects and have found different ways to make 4 and 5. We have learnt the /h/ and /b/ sound this week and have practised our blending skills when reading.

Year 2

Year 2 have continued to learn about Mary Seacole in theme this week, they thought about the conditions that she worked in and compared them to modern day hospitals. Within our Science work we continued to look at properties of materials and thought about what materials our houses are made of and why. Year two have also enjoyed the start of the shape unit in Maths, identifying the vertices and sides as well as drawing their own shapes.

Year 3

Year Three have been working very hard doing assessments this week and practicing carols for our end of term carol singing! Our new topic has begun this week. We started by recapping the continents and the countries of the UK. We will be learning about Europe.

Year 4

This week in Year 4, the children finished their diary entries on the discovery of Tutankhamun's tomb, and we have finished our class novel of The Ancient Egypt Sleepover. The class loved the ending of the book! Our new class novel is The Thieves of Ostia. This leads us nicely into our new topic of The Romans! To start our topic, the children looked at who the Romans were and where they came from. In Science, we are continuing to learn about classification. The children collected leaves from around the school grounds and classified them in different ways. In Maths, we are developing our knowledge of multiplication and division facts, focusing primarily on the 3,6,7 and 9 times tables.

Year 5

Year Five have been exploring the internet in their computing lessons this week. They have been investigating how everything we learn online is not true. They searched the same questions about the same explorer (Christopher Columbus) using different websites and received conflicting information from every site. One site even said he had died before he was born! This prompted us into looking into ways of searching effectively so that we don't waste hours trawling through inaccurate information and arming ourselves with tools to ensure we can evaluate websites safety and accurately. In Science we have been continuing to investigate materials. This week we investigated the properties of different materials. We investigated whether the materials are electrical conductors, transparent, strong thermal conductors or magnetic.

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Year 6

After much discussing, measuring, sawing, and glueing, we finally finished our long ships! They are automata toys which use cams and followers to create movement. While the function of the end product is, of course, important, the techniques we learnt and skills we developed along the way far outweigh this. They are on display by the window in our classroom – have a look as you come into the playground!
