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EYFS

This week we have finished making our robots, to support our learning about Harry and the Robots. We then wrote about our robot's special powers!

In Phonics we have been learning the ch and qu sounds. Thank you for reading at home. In RE we have been learning the story of Jesus and the little children. We learnt that Jesus welcomed and blessed the little children because he knew they were important.

Year 2

Year 2 really enjoyed their art this week. They were exploring painting texture, starting with painting different textures using different objects including cardboard and foil. They then painted a given object ensuring they captured the texture of it. Within English the children started the new unit of 'biographies' they started this by finding out what a biography is and then talking to their peers about their life.

Year 3

The children in Year 3 have been working hard on their story writing this week and are writing their own adventure stories. In maths they have been learning to multiply and divide and the relationship between these calculations. The biggest challenge they have faced this week is using the laptops to send emails to each other. The children have learnt to log on to the computers and their own email and how to write an email. In DT they are designing and making castles.

Year 4

Year 4 have been working hard on turning a page from the class novel, The Thieves of Ostia, into a playscript. Using excellent adverbs and useful stage directions, the children are making good progress in becoming playwrights. In RE, we focused on the baptism of Jesus and what that means to us today. In maths, the children have been looking at multiplying 2-digit or 3-digit numbers by 1-digit numbers.

Year 5

Year Five enjoyed working as structural engineers and investigating beam and arch bridges in Design and Technology. They found that a simple arch will reinforce a bridge so that it will hold much more weight. They worked in pairs to develop ways of improving their bridges so that they could hold more weight. They found a concertina and a corrugated design were the strongest. We have also enjoyed investigating just how bad life was for Victorian factory children. The conclusion? It was worse than we first thought!

Year 6

This week, we have focused on developing our writing skills. Our current class text, *The Lion and the Unicorn,* is about an evacuee, Lenny, who feels lost and lonely in the countryside. We made predictions about what could happen next in the story and have been busy planning our version of how the story could unfold. One aim has been to 'show, not tell' the reader about the characters and setting. We have tried to do this by using similes, metaphors and other literary devices.
