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EYFS

In Reception this week we have been learning about Shrove Tuesday. The children wrote some fantastic lists of what we need to use to make pancakes and enjoyed making playdoh pancakes as well. They are becoming more and more confident in using their phonics sounds to write simple words. On Wednesday we were lucky enough to have Father Seelan come to our classroom to distribute the ashes and we have also been learning the words of the Glory Be prayer.

Year 1

This week in Year 1, the children have been busy designing and building their own windmills. They had to cut out the template's carefully and accurately to then assemble the structure and the wind turbine. They all worked incredibly hard and have created some fantastic windmills.

Year 2

Year two have enjoyed collaging in English, they started off by drawing an outline of one of the women they have been learning about and then cut up paper to create a collage. The children also worked really hard on their stories in English, they wrote a story of Katherine who was a mathematician and worked for NASA. Within Maths the children enjoyed learning about odd and even, they learnt why a number is odd or even and explained why.

Year 3

Year three have been finishing their work on castles by completing the castle models and then writing non-chronological reports about all the different types of castles and their features. In Science the children devised their own magnet experiment to show their increased understanding.



Year 4

Year Four have started their work on mystery narratives, using senses, similes and metaphors to show, not tell, the reader what is happening in the story. Year Four have also started building their catapults in DT. Using hacksaws, the children cut out their wood pieces, ready for construction. In maths, we have begun our topic on length and perimeter.





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Year 5

Year Five have worked hard on mastering new methods for multiplication in Maths this week. They have practised short multiplication and long multiplication. We will be working hard after half term to make sure we are all confident with these strategies. In DT we have continued with our Bridges topic and have worked on making spaghetti truss bridges and learnt how different shapes can help improve strength. We also worked in groups in History to make the case for the greatest invention of the Industrial Revolution. There are many to choose from including the steam engine, typewriter, telephone, streetlights and the flushing toilet!

Year 6

Having learnt about Darwin and his theory of evolution in a previous Science lesson, this week we carried out an experiment to show how animals evolve over time to adapt to their surroundings. Using chopsticks, pegs and tweezers to represent bird beaks, we observed which 'beak' was most suitable for picking up different kinds of 'seeds'.
