EYFS

In Reception this week we have been focusing our work around Spring. We went on a walk to look for signs of Spring and the children wrote captions for pictures of Spring things. We also talked about the changes that we have noticed as the seasons have changed. The children completed some lovely observational drawings of daffodils.

Year 1

In Year One, the children have enjoyed exploring the text 'Bee and me'. As the books has no words, the children have been creating their own sentences to match each picture. In maths, the children have begun to count in 2's and 10's. This has been quite tricky but they have persevered. A highlight of the week has been exploring the Beebots in our computing lesson. The children were fascinated with how they could make them move in different directions.

Year 2

This week in year two, the children were really excited to explore clay. They learnt different techniques to manipulate the clay and then create an animal out of it. Within Theme the children found out about weather patterns, they looked at the weather patterns of the United Kingdom both throughout a day and over through the seasons. They also enjoyed Science week. The children went on a plant hunt around the field, identifying which plants we have within school. The children also learnt about equal and unequal parts within their Maths to support them in their new fractions unit.

Year 3

In Maths Year 3 are continuing to learn about Fractions. They can now order fractions on a number line and are beginning to spot equivalent fractions. In English they have begun to look at newspaper reports. Our Greek topic continues for a few more weeks. This week they learnt about the story of Troy and the wooden horse.

Year 4

Welcome to the Summer Term! In English, the children have started to plan for their new piece of writing: a dialogue narrative. In Maths, we have started on our new topic of decimals, looking at converting tenths from fractions to decimals. In our theme lesson, we explored the topic of deforestation and looked at the issues that are caused by deforestation. In Science, we've started our new topic of electricity.

Year 5

Year Five are writing diary entries from members of Ernest Shackleton's *Endurance* 1914 expedition to the South Pole. They have thoroughly enjoyed researching this treacherous and ill-fated expedition during their reading lessons. The children have chosen one of Shackleton's 27 crew members to represent and are trying to include details of their role and personality in their entries. In Maths, the children have impressed us all by how quickly they have taken to multiplying fractions. Thank you again for all your support with helping the children to revise their times tables at home with Times Table Rock Stars – it is really showing in these lessons!

Year 6

We have been busy recapping our knowledge ahead of our upcoming SATs tests. In English, we read a poem called 'Going Down Hill on a Bicycle'. This poem uses some archaic language which we found difficult to understand, but after reading it aloud and paying attention to the punctuation, we could grasp what image the poet was trying to create. In Maths, we have focused on 'angles' and have tackled some challenging word problems.
