School Performance Data 2017

As many of you will have heard in the media in the last week the school performance data for KS2 children was released. I am pleased to say that, when we compare our school performance against the national measures, we have once again performed well. One measure I would like to highlight is that nationally 61% of children achieved the expected standard at the end of year 6 in reading, writing and mathematics. At Sacred Heart 80% of children achieved this standard, resulting in the school exceeding this measure by 19%. Please use the link below to see the full breakdown of our school performance data.
