Year 1	Year 2
To conclude our Families topic we spent time in the chapel reflecting on what we have learnt. The children then used their knowledge to look again at the big question; why do we have families and who is in my family? They have shown a good understanding of their own immediate family and also that we are all part of God's family and that he shows us love and care in lots of different ways.	This week in RE we have finished our topic 'Beginnings'. We re-answered the Big Question 'Who made the world and everything in it?'. The children's answers were much more detailed than when they answered at the start of the topic. Next week we look forward to learning about Judaism.
Year 3	Year 4
Year 3 have finished their domestic church unit this week. The children answered the big question 'What makes a house a home?' considering everything that they had learnt during lessons. This included reflecting on St Paul's letter from Colossians 3: 12-17 and how God is always present in the lives of Christians. In the final lesson, the children went to chapel to take part in an act of worship reflecting on their thoughts and feelings about what they had learnt.	This week we have remembered and celebrated our own family trees and the family of Jesus in scripture. We have once again thought about the Big Question: <i>where do I come from?</i> We have thought about how we can show our gratitude to our family and will hopefully act this out.
Year 5	Year 6
This week, we finished the topic 'Ourselves'. The children wrote their own response to the Big Question 'Who am I?' The class produced very thoughtful responses, reflecting upon their unique God-given gifts and the love that God has for each individual. It was also wonderful to hear the children's reflective responses within the Act of Worship during chapel time.	This week we have carried out our end of unit Act of Worship. The reflective worship in the chapel was lead wonderfully by our school chaplains, who helped us to bring together all of our thoughts and feelings regarding the last 4 weeks of R.E lessons. The children then completed an end of unit assessment, which included answering our 'big question': Do you have to earn love? The children produced thoughtful work which was grounded in scripture and references to parables.
