Year 1	Year 2
This week in RE, Year 1 have been learning about psalms and how they are special songs and prayers. We listened to Psalm 28 which thanks God for taking care of us. We talked about which lines the children liked best and why, as well as how the psalm tells us how God cares for us. Some of the children illustrated the psalm while others wrote their own thank you prayer	In Year Two, we have been thinking about psalms and how they are a song of praise to God. The class read and discussed psalm 19 v1-5 and psalm 8 v1-3. Both of these reminded the children that God created the world and that he is always close by. We also listened to Morning from the Peer Gynt Suites and thought about how this would be a good piece of music for psalm 19.
Year 3	Year 4
This week in RE we have been thinking about what Jesus' life would have been like at home with Mary and Joseph and what they would have valued in their home life. We looked at an artist's interpretation of Jesus' childhood and thought about his day to day life. We discussed how prayer can ease our worries and thought about why we pray and what we pray for.	This week, Year 4 learnt all about Jesus' family tree- they created the family tree and talked about the key people. Also, they listened to the story from The Old Testament of Abraham, Sarah and their son Isaac. They retold the story with a focus on how Abraham put his trust in God and why he did this.
Year 5	Year 6
This week in Year Five we have been continuing our topic 'Ourselves'. Children recapped on last week's work about qualities. Together as a class we looked at Colossians 3:12-17 and discussed how we are God's people and how we should behave to one another. We then explored the idea of being a Peacemaker and what this entails.	RE Overview - This week in R.E, year 6 have continued to explore the big question, 'Do we have to earn love?'. We have studied the words of Isaiah and compared the similarities between how a shepherd loves his sheep, how a parent loves their child and how God loves the world. We have also looked at the Parable of the Prodigal Son, where we spent time highlighting and discussing moments of unconditional love.

 PETERBOROUGH SOUP KITCHEN (PSK) is a local charity which has operated since 1983. Its aim is to ensure that the homeless and disadvantaged people of Peterborough get some hot soup, food and drinks, throughout the year, whatever the weather conditions. Soup, hot and cold drinks plus sandwiches are prepared in the kitchen and then taken by van to the car park, behind The Brewery Tap pub in the centre of Peterborough, where between 35-55 clients are served each night. At present our parish provides 2 teams of volunteers to help One team provides support on a Thursday night and the other team works on a Friday night.
